



Greg Coote Scholarship 2020

Screen Queensland is calling out for writers and creators ready to take the next big step in their career with international writers' room experience.

Now in its fourth year, the Greg Coote Scholarship – established by Screen Queensland and Australians in Film – honours the work of one of Australia's most prolific industry figures and continues his extraordinary legacy of opening doors for Australian talent in the global screen industry.

The Scholarship – launched by actor Hugh Jackman in late 2014 – offers a writer or creator working in narrative fiction (drama and genre) the opportunity to spend a minimum of 6-8 weeks in an established series writers' room. Worth approximately \$30,000 (AUD), the Scholarship will fund the costs of the placement, including travel and visas, and provide a small weekly wage to the recipient.

This year, a pool of approximately five writers/creators will be shortlisted for the Scholarship. These writers will be presented to established international writers' rooms for consideration and at least one will be selected to take part in the 2020 program.

Who can apply?

Queensland writers and creators who are building a career in scripted content.

While this opportunity is best suited to mid-career writers/creators who have some experience in screenwriting such as broadcast, feature film, short film or web series, your application will be assessed first and foremost on the strength of your talent and potential.

How do I apply?

Submit an application at https://screenqueensland.smartygrants.com.au/ by 5pm, Friday 17 January 2020.

You will find out if you've been successful in making the pool of shortlisted writers/creators in late March 2020.

What do I need to give you?

You'll need to provide:

- A screenwriting sample (up to 30 pages)
- Your CV
- Responses to the following questions:
 - O Why are you the best candidate for the 2020 Greg Coote Scholarship?
 - What are your career goals and how do you plan to achieve them? (consider what role the Greg Coote Scholarship would play in your plan)
 - If you could be a part of the writers room for any on-air TV series what would it be and why?

What are you looking for?

The Greg Coote Committee, including the Coote family, as well as Australians in Film and Screen Queensland, will select the pool of shortlisted writers/creators based on the following criteria:

- Talent demonstrated through the quality of their previous work and their screenwriting sample
- Demonstrated passion and potential for creating and writing series television such as scripts in development or past credits
- **Readiness** to take part in an international writers room and **impact** this experience will have on the career of the writer/creator and the state screen sector more broadly?

When will the Scholarship take place?

The scholarship will take place for at least 6-8 weeks in 2020. The exact dates will be determined depending on the writers room.

Which writers room will the successful applicant take part in?

The international writers room opportunity will be matched to the needs and interests of the shortlisted pool of writers/creators. Previous Scholarship recipients have been a part of writers rooms for CBS, eOne and FremantleMedia.

About Greg Goote

Greg Coote was one of Australia's most prolific industry figures. Greg ran LA-based Larrikin Entertainment with David Calvert-Jones; he was a producer and financier of theatrical movies, television programs and digital entertainment content. He was also a non-executive director of Bollywood distributor Eros International, chairman of US distributor China Lion, chairman of the ScreenSingapore convention and a member of the advisory board of the Singapore Government's Media Development Authority. Previously Greg was chairman and CEO of Dune Entertainment, which co-financed more than 60 movies with 20th Century Fox, including Avatar.

Born in Australia, Greg started his career in the mailroom, working his way from the ground up to become Managing Director of Roadshow Films. He left Village Roadshow to head the Rupert Murdoch-owned Network Ten as Managing Director before joining Columbia Pictures in Los Angeles as President, International Theatrical. He re-joined Village Roadshow when it became publicly listed and was appointed to the parent board. As the founding president and CEO of Village Roadshow Pictures in Los Angeles, he steered the company through 10 consecutive years of profits and forged a multi-million-dollar production deal with Warner Bros, including The Matrix franchise.

Not only was Greg prolific in business, he was also an extraordinary leader and advocate for the arts in the public schools. Greg founded an arts endowment campaign to fund arts programs in perpetuity and to create a model for other school districts around the state and country. He was a generous and strong individual who was able to bring people along with him when it came to making sure that the arts remained part of the public school curriculum.

AiF host monthly screenings and special events to celebrate the work of Australian film and television makers.
